Course Description

This course explores jazz-centered repertoire from the Great American Songbook, standards, popular songs, as well as gospel and Brazilian songs. In this course, students will learn the basics of harmony, ear-training, and sight-singing as it pertains to multi-part a cappella ensemble singing. This will include singing dissonances, outlining chords, and speaking rhythms. Students will also learn the rudiments of vocal health and will learn basic warm-up exercises.

Rehearsals

Time: TBD – Three-hour (3) rehearsal, one time per week

Because we will only rehearse one time per week, come prepared with water – BE ON TIME! We will have a lot to go through each week.

Warm up prior to rehearsals.

Listen and practice PRIOR to coming to rehearsal. Your grade will be dependent upon you being prepared for each rehearsal IN ADVANCE. You MUST practice the songs, as in most songs each voice will sing independently of the other voices. Your part will compromise the integrity of the music if you are not prepared!

 - Showing up at the designated time
