UF Hosts 2nd Annual International Brass Festival February 4-5, 2017

Gainesville, Fla., Jan. 16, 2017 — The University of Florida (UF) School of Music is pleased to present the 2017 International Brass Festival at the UF School of Music February 4-5, 2017 in Gainesville, Florida. The two-day event will feature internationally recognized guest artists Nathan Zgonc, Christian Paarup, the U.S. Air Force Band Trombone Quartet, the University of Tennessee Faculty Brass Quintet and more. The festival includes numerous master classes and recitals and is open to musicians of all ages. All events are free and open to the public.

New to the International Brass Festival in 2017 are the Edwards Trumpet Solo Competition, sponsored by Edwards Instruments. The final round of the competition will consist of a live recital at the festival. Additionally, an exhibit room will feature many popular brass manufacturers such as: Bach, Conn, Yamaha, Edwards, Shires, Getzen, Cannonball, Courtoius, Meinl-Weston, Besson and more, as well as an extensive selection of sheet music for sale by Beethoven & Co.
