## 300 UF Performers with Appear in UF's Annual Holiday Concert, *Sounds of the Season:* December's Holidays and Sentiments, on December 3

The University of Florida (UF) College of the Arts and the School of Music are pleased to present the annual holiday concert, *Sounds of the Season* on Sunday, Dec. 3, 2017 at 7 p.m. at the Phillips Center for the Performing Arts in Gainesville, Florida.

With the theme of *December Holidays and Sentiments,* this year's concert, which is free and open to the public, will feature an array of holiday favorites such as *Ring Those Christmas Bells* made famous by the icon pop/country singer Patti Page. The concert will open with the rousing traditional English carol *Christmas Is Coming*, where the sentiment of helping the poor is expressed. The concert will close with Georg Friedrich Händel's *Hallelujah Chorus* as seen through the eyes of the African American entertainment mogul Quincy Jones. In between you will be treated to a multicultural collage representing the six holidays celebrated in December with other traditional musical expressions of Seasonal sentiments.

With generous support by President Fuchs, Sounds of the Season: December Holidays and Sentiments will feature more than 300 performers from UF's Concert Choir, Women's Chorale, Symphony Orchestra, Gospel Choir and Jazz Band augmented by area community singers of the Gainesville Master Chorale, and an array of student soloists.



"Sounds of the Season has a wonderful sixty-nine-year seasonal legacy," said Dr. Will Kesling, the Sounds of the Season director. "This concert gathers the entire community and offers a time for us all to pause and escape from the hectic, and nowadays, frightful outside world into a delightful inner world of comfort and joy."
