COURSE OBJECTIVES

- To create intelligent and honest scene work through agreement, character creation, team building, and active listening

- Apply your skills to the creation of long form improvisations

REQUIRED TEXTS

Readings will come in the form of handouts.

EXPECTATIONS

This class is a space where you respect, support, and encourage your fellow actors. In order to grow as a performer, you will be asked to take risks in the games, exercises, and performance pieces you do for class. Come to class prepared to move. Warm-ups can be physically demanding (rolling on the floor is not uncommon). Don't wear clothes you are afraid to get "mussed" or limit your mobility such as high heels. Gym-like attire is recommended. There is no eating, drinking, gum chewing, laptop, or cell phone use.

ATTENDANCE

This is a class about participation – attendance is a given. You are expected to arrive ON TIME and to attend ALL classes. You cannot improvise by yourself. Therefore, it is impossible to make-up class time. The following absences are excused: illness (doctor's note required), religious holidays, and documented participation in official university activities. Weddings, job interviews, auditions, and other life events do not count as excused absences. You are allowed two unexcused absences with no penalty. Three unexcused absences will lower your Attendance grade to a C. If you have four absences, you will fail the course. Missing a team presentation or final performance will also lower your participation grade. If you have a logistical problem that is preventing you from arriving on time, you must let me know immediately. Three tardies will result in an absence.
