Course Description: Conducting I is an introduction to basic conducting concepts focusing on the relationship of gesture to sound, acquisition of basic conducting techniques, and the fundamentals of score reading and score preparation.

Learning Objectives:

The student conductor will:

- Demonstrate appropriate conducting posture and hand/baton positions
- Demonstrate adequate skill in basic gestural techniques
- Demonstrate appropriate score study/score preparation habits through use of piano and part-singing
- Demonstrate adequate skill in conducting historically appropriate performances through adequate score preparation
- Demonstrate ability to appropriately assess conducting performances
- Exhibit knowledge of basic conducting terminology

Learning Activities to meet the Objectives:

Conducting Gesture Tests (6)

[10 points each, total: 60 points]

There will be six (6) conducting technique tests taken during the weekly ten-minute lessons. Tests will assess the student's ability to demonstrate:

1. Basic patterns, prep, beats and cut-offs
2. Basic articulations and dynamic changes

3. Accents and gesture of syncopation
4. Subdivision
5. Fermatas
6. Use of left hand

Classroom Participation [30 points]

Each student will be assigned a total of four (4) in-class conducting sessions. The student is responsible for obtaining an adequate audio/video recording of his/her conducting session.

In addition, each student will be expected to prepare **ALL** pieces covered during the course. Each student will adequately prepare his/her vocal line **AND** be able to conduct the ensemble through the piece.

Conducting Self-Assessments (4) [10 points each, total: 40 points]

The student will complete a Conductor's Self-Assessment Form (provided) following each of his/her 4 assigned in-class conducting sessions. The student will be assessed on the quality of his/her reflections in each of the assessment subcategories. *DUE 24 HOURS AFTER CONDUCTING SESSION. Turn-in to your current instructor (Birkner or Davis)*

Professional conductor evaluation [10 points]

The student will write a 500-word evaluation on a professional conductor. The evaluation must be on a conductor of a college choir, orchestra, or wind band – or a similar professional ensemble in a live **performance** (not rehearsal) outside of class. Evaluations should be based on observations of conducting techniques and musicianship discussed in class. The student may not evaluate a conductor's performance in which he/she is participating. *DUE 12/7 by 4pm.*

Perfect Attendance means no absences (excused or unexcused) or tardies.

- In the case of an absence due to participation in an official university activity, observance of a religious holiday, performance of a military duty, or any other university-approved absence (e.g., jury duty) which the student knows about in advance, the student is expected to notify the instructor of the conflict *before the absence*, and if possible at the start of the semester.
- There are NO make-ups for missed in-class conducting sessions. If you have an **excused** absence for your assigned conducting session, you will be given the opportunity to write a 5-page paper on a topic approved by the instructor, due 4pm on the final day of classes (day before the Thursday “Reading Day”).
- For all other assignments, the students will not be granted an extension or be permitted to make up the assignment without an acceptable reason, such as an illness or serious family emergencies, in accordance with university policies on absences.
- Lesson appointments during Friday class counts toward the attendance record.
- Two tardy days = one absence.
