Allison Wyatt was a kind-hearted girl who had a lot of love to give. Allison loved drawing and wanted to be an artist, often turning parts of her family's house into an "art studio" with rows of pictures taped to the walls. She also wanted to be a teacher.

Although at just 6 years old, her life was cut short during the Sandy Hook Elementary School shooting in Newtown, Connecticut, the Allison Wyatt Memorial Scholarship created by her parents, as her mother is a University of Florida alumna, allows Allison's dreams of being an artist and teacher live on through others.
