She became interested in the carillon after experiencing the warmth and legacy of the Century Tower bells once moving on campus her freshman year. Beth became a member of the UF Carillon Studio in January 2022 where she would go on to earn the Web Carillon Scholarship for her dedication and scholastic achievement in carillon studies. Last summer she attended the 80th Annual Guild of Carillonneurs of North America Congress in Cohasset, MA where she became a member of the guild.
