300 UF Performers and Special Guest Ensemble Vocal de Medellín Appear in UF's Annual Holiday Concert, *Sounds of the Season: ¡el Festival!*, on December 4

Gainesville, Fla., Nov. 21, 2016 — The University of Florida (UF) College of the Arts and the School of Music are pleased to present the annual holiday concert, *Sounds of the Season*, on Sunday, Dec. 4, 2016 at 7 p.m. at the Phillips Center for the Performing Arts in Gainesville, Florida. With the theme of *¡el Festival!*, this year's concert, which is free and open to the public, will feature an array of holiday favorites such as an encore presentation of *O Holy Night* sung by Joshua Mazur as well as seasonal music from Latin America and Spain. The concert will open with the Christmas Processional and the ancient Spanish pilgrim's song *Stella splendens* (Splendid Star) and will close with Georg Friedrich Händel's *Hallelujah Chorus*. In between, audience members will be treated to toe-tapping music from around the Spanish speaking world: a seasonal salsa, samba, danza, bossa nova and more.

With generous support from UF President Kent Fuchs, *Sounds of the Season: ¡el Festival!* will feature more than 300 performers, including UF School of Music professors Welton Tremura and Scott Wilson with the UF Jazz Band, students from UF's Concert Choir, UF Women's Chorale and UF Symphony Orchestra, as well as area community members from the Gainesville Master Chorale.



"*Sounds of the Season* is a wonderful seasonal legacy, and it is particularly special this year as it will feature special guest artists Ensemble Vocal de Medellín, a professional Colombian choir, under the direction of Jorge Hernán Arango García," said Will Kesling, professor and choral program director in the UF School of Music. "This concert gathers the entire community and offers a time for us all to pause and escape from the hectic, and nowadays, frightful outside world into a delightful inner world of comfort and joy."
