**Course Description**

The course is designed to improve students cutting and sewing skills through both lecture/demonstration and hands-on participation. Students will complete projects both in-class and outside of class time to acquire more advanced costume construction skills and to demonstrate their mastery of those skills.

**Course Objectives**

- The student will learn to identify fabric.
- The student will learn to prepare a pattern.
- The student will learn the proper methods for cutting fabric.
- The student will learn sewing techniques appropriate for a variety of fabrics.
- The student will learn construction and finishing techniques.
- The student will apply the techniques learned in class to realize projects and finished garments.

## Attendance

### Absences:

Due to the laboratory style and cumulative nature of the knowledge and skill acquired in this class, attendance is mandatory. Students will be graded on individual projects as well as class participation. Therefore each student will be allowed 2 unexcused absences. **Each unexcused absence beyond 2 will result in the lowering of the student's attendance portion of the final grade by 5 points.** An absence may be excused if appropriate documentation of an illness or extenuating circumstance is provided. Students are responsible for making up any missed information or in- class projects that were covered during each absence. Arrangements must be made with the instructor for the making up of missed in-class projects and are subject to availability of the costume studio based upon the needs of other courses and the production schedule.

### Tardiness:

All classes start at the specified time. Students are expected to be ready for instruction or class work at the beginning of each class period. **Each late arrival will result in a ½ point reduction of the attendance portion of the student's grade.**

## Due Dates

Projects are due as stated on the course schedule and should be ready at the start of class. Critique and discussion of projects will occur within class time for that day. Failure to have a project ready reduces the effectiveness of the student's class participation and demonstrates the student's inability to meet deadlines. If a student foresees being unable to have a project ready, please contact me and a possible extension can be considered. As deadlines are extremely important in a professional setting and we are striving to prepare you to be working professionals, the need for extensions should be avoided.

## Grading

## **Project 1 – Sewing Samples**

A sample book will be created using the following techniques:

Straight seam – wool, velvet  
Straight seam matching pattern  
French seam – chiffon  
Curved piecing  
Square piecing  
Continuous Lap Placket

Cross stitch hem - wool, Taped hem - velvet  
Tunnel stitch hem – patterned fabric  
Rolled machine hem - chiffon  
Shirt tail hem - muslin  
Machine Blind hem - muslin  
zipper

## **Project 2 – Corset or Vest**

Select from the corset or vest options provided. You may create this project to fit yourself or someone else. The fabric and bones (for corset) will be cut using this pattern. The corset or vest will be assembled and finished.

## **Project – Garment**

Select a pattern to create a garment of your choice. Please have 2 – 3 options available for proposal. You may create this project to fit yourself or someone else. You will cut, construct, fit and finish the garment. Through discussion of the difficulty and approach we will select the best option to use in this project, but the garment should include at least one from each of the following categories:

### Fabric choice

Print  
With Nap  
Chiffon/Silky  
Wool

### Closure

Zipper  
Buttons &  
Buttonholes

### Construction details

Piecing  
Pintucks  
Gathering/Ruffles  
Welt pockets

You may discuss with me other options within these categories to achieve a successful and challenging garment.
