Syllabus

Enrollment into the bassoon studio consists of weekly lessons on Monday and masterclass which meets the same day at 12:50pm.

Exceptions to that are school recognized holidays. You are required to perform once during the semester at a Woodwind Area Recital which are during the masterclass time. In addition to the Woodwind Area Recital, the studio will perform a recital together on a date that a room is available and that is agreeable by all students and myself. The repertoire will consist of bassoon solo and ensemble music.

Lessons will consist of weekly etudes from the standard repertoire. Excerpts and solo repertoire will be discussed individually. Reed making is required and will be the subject of the first masterclass, August 29th 2016. The following week, September 5th 2016, is Labor Day Holiday and there will be no lessons or masterclass. The following masterclasses will focus on individual playing, your ensemble music, and/or rehearsing bassoon ensemble music. You are encouraged to work with your colleagues on reeds and ensemble music outside of masterclass.

Juries are on December 12th 2016 and will consist of the repertoire worked on during the semester. A sign-up sheet will be made available for you to sign up for a time. Five (5) different selections are required and may consist of etudes, solo work, and/or orchestral excerpts. Three (3) copies of the music are required. Each copy must have a cover sheet showing your name, course number, and the music prepared. Each piece must have the title of the piece, the composer, and the living dates of the composer.
