THINGS TO KNOW

- You can begin the SlideRoom portfolio application process and edit it several times before finally submitting by the deadline.
- It is *highly recommended* that you begin working in SlideRoom as soon as possible! (We find that many questions about the portfolio process will be answered for you within the SlideRoom form.)
- We ask you to submit no more than 10 images of your best work in a .PDF file that demonstrate your creativity, skill, and thinking process as an artist and/or designer. In the "description," please include any brief notes you want us to know about the piece.
- Work, imagery, and/or concept influenced by or originating from another source (i.e. Google, Instagram, another artist, etc.) must be notated in the description box provided; failure to cite sources and/or influences of work may be considered plagiarism.
- PDF files should be 10MB max.

PORTFOLIO TIPS

- Select the projects that best represent you as an artist, as well as your skill and experience.
- The portfolio should include work that you believe is relevant to how you express yourself as an artist.
 Avoid overly commercial approaches to work in your portfolio (ex: wedding or product photography, fan art commissions, etc.)
- The work should be organized and show the emergence of a creative vision and theme.
- There is no formula for the right portfolio. (Always strive to submit your best work!)
- Quality documentation is important; images should be in focus, well lit, represent colors accurately, without shadow or glare, etc.
- The final decision about what to put in your portfolio is up to YOU!
- We require *no more than* 10 images, here are examples of how you might present multiple views/images of a related work together so it counts as one "image."



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- Use a program of your choice to create your PDF portfolio. Some possible choices are:
 - Google Slides/Microsoft PowerPoint Create a slideshow with images, descriptions and links, then export the slideshow as a PDF file
 - o **Google Docs/Microsoft Word –** Create a document with images, descriptions and links, then export the document as a PDF file
 - o Adobe Creative Suite, Canva

HOW TO SET UP YOUR MEDIA/PORTFOLIO SUBMISSION AS A PDF: THE BASICS

To streamline the review process, you will be uploading ONE (1) PDF that includes ALL the attachments of your works you are submitting for your portfolio. You will incorporate each attachment (e.g. still images, audio/visual hosting links) with a brief description for each attachment into one PDF file (max file size: 10MB).

Basic Requirements for your PDF Portfolio

File Name format*: "FirstNameLastName-FreshmanPortfolio"

*We are not strict about this since all portfolios will be clearly marked by SlideRoom, but it's good practice!


Number of Pages/Slides: 10 MAXIMUM. One (1) Page/Slide = One (1) Artwork

- The portfolio should depict the best possible representation of your creative work and should demonstrate the following:
 - Creativity
 - Imagination and innovation
 - o Development of idea and concepts
 - Visual organization
 - Craft and technical competence
- We recommend showing a diversity of work, so consider projects from all the courses you have taken.
- Submit no more than 10 images. *
 - *If appropriate, include additional detail images
 - o *If a web site is included, submit up to 3 screen grabs from the website along with the website.
 - o *For video, submit up to 3 still(s)/screen grab(s) from the video along with the link to the full video.
 - o *For sound, if appropriate include the cover image along with the link to the full sound.
- Each piece should indicate the dimensions of the piece, media used, date created and may also include a written description of the work and concept (no more than 50 words). See examples in the guide below.

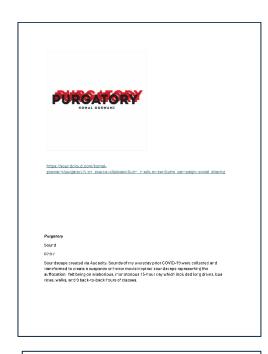
