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Course Objectives:

- -to expose the student to different styles of life performing arts other then theatre, (Opera, Ballet, Modern Dance, Musical Theatre) and understand the implications for a stage designer.
- to design for more complex, multi-set shows under simulated production conditions
- to be creative while designing a period piece

Course Description: - This is an advanced studio course where students will apply and refine their knowledge of using the principals of *Scenic Design* as is related to Theatre and Entertainment Industry. They will work and refine their skills in developing a design based on a particular script and delivering a professional, complete scene design package in timely manner. Students will receive individual guidance throughout the semester through the development of their personal design concept and aesthetic.

- -paintbrushes: #0, 2, 4, 6, 7, 10 and a 1-1/2" to 2" regular paintbrush
