Course Description

The course is designed to improve students' cutting and sewing skills through both lecture/ demonstration and hands- on participation. Students will complete projects both in- class and outside of class time to acquire more advanced costume construction skills and to demonstrate their mastery of those skills.

Course Objectives

- The student will learn to identify fabric.
- The student will learn to prepare a pattern.
- The student will learn the proper methods for cutting fabric.
- The student will learn sewing techniques appropriate for a variety of fabrics.
- The student will learn how to fit a mockup and translate alterations to the pattern/garment.
- The student will learn construction and finishing techniques.
- The student will apply the techniques learned in class to realize projects and finished garments.

Attendance

Absences:

Due to the laboratory style and cumulative nature of the knowledge and skill acquired in this class, attendance is mandatory. Students will be graded on individual projects as well as class participation. Students are responsible for making up any missed information or in-class projects that were covered during each absence. Arrangements must be made with the instructor for the making up of missed in-class projects and are subject to availability of the costume studio based upon the needs of other courses and the production schedule.

Tardiness:

All classes start at the specified time. Students are expected to be ready for instruction or class work at the beginning of each class period.

As deadlines are extremely important in a professional setting and we are striving to prepare you to be working professionals, the need for extensions should be avoided.

The course is designed to allow the student to gain costume construction skills and knowledge that are useful as a designer and technologist. The ability to understand and execute the construction of garments is highly advantageous. To do so within a scheduled time frame is crucial. Therefore, grading is based on attendance and class participation, as well as the accuracy and timeliness of individual projects.

Project 1 – Samples

A sample book will be created using the following techniques:

Straight seam – wool, velvet Cross stitch hem - wool, Taped hem - velvet

Straight seam matching pattern Tunnel stitch hem – patterned fabric

French seam – chiffon Rolled machine hem - chiffon

Curved piecing Shirt tail hem - muslin Square piecing Blind hemmer - muslin

Continuous Lap Placket zipper

Project 2 – Bodice/Corset/Vest/Doublet

Select a bodice, corset, vest or doublet to construct. Please have 2-3 options available for proposal. Through discussion of the difficulty and approach we will select the best option to use in this project. Create or modify the pattern for this project. Cut, construct and finish this project. You may create this project to fit yourself or someone else.

Project 3 – Period Garment

Select a period garment to construct for a live person. You will create or modify the pattern for this project, cut, construct, fit and finish the garment. You may create this project to fit yourself or someone else. Please have 2-3 options available for proposal. Through discussion of the difficulty and approach we will select the best option to use in this project, but the following criteria should be considered:

Fabric choice <u>Closure</u> <u>Construction details</u>

Print Zipper Piecing
With Nap Buttons & Pintucks

Chiffon/Silky Buttonholes Gathering/Ruffles
Wool Grommet & Welt pockets

Lacing Bias cut
