Objectives and Description

Jacaré Brazil, dedicated to learning Brazilian culture through musical performance. The percussion section of Jacaré Brazil meets as a separate unit to begin the semester and is then combined with the vocal, string, and wind components of Jacaré later in the semester. During the semester students will learn to perform a variety of Brazilian musical styles on Brazilian musical instruments.

Requirements and Policies

Members are expected to learn and practice their parts and come to rehearsals prepared to perform (in some cases written music will be distributed, in other cases you will be expected to learn your part aurally from recordings). Everyone is expected to help set up and strike equipment used during the rehearsals. This means coming ten minutes prior to the rehearsal time. Students with disabilities requesting accommodations should first register with the Disability Resource Center (352-392-8565, www.dso.ufl.edu/drc/) by providing appropriate documentation. Once registered, students will receive an accommodation letter, which must be presented to the instructor when requesting accommodation.

Assessment/Grading

You grade is determined by attendance and effort in this class. If you attend rehearsals and performances, practice your parts and try your best you will receive an A for the course. If you do not show up to rehearsals or come consistently late to rehearsals or miss a performance, you will receive less than an A. Attendance: 50%; Effort: 50%.
