Frequently Asked Questions

When is the event? We will convene on October 21 at 8:30 am at Oregon State University CH2M Hill Alumni Center. The day's program will begin promptly at 9:00 am and will conclude at 5:00 pm.

Where is it?

Who will be there? There will be approximately 50 people. Our group will include practitioners, educators, researchers, policy-makers, thought leaders and other stakeholders from the arts, public health, creative placemaking and community development sectors.

What should I expect? A dynamic and interactive day of knowledge and practice sharing, provocation, embodied dialogue, and strategic visioning. The day is designed to move quickly and to draw out deep and broad thinking as well as new ideas and partnerships.
