Course Description

The Clarinet Ensemble at the University of Florida is designed to further the performance skill and exposure level of various and diverse repertoire for chamber ensembles comprising of clarinets.

Course Objectives

To expand ones sight-reading ability, develop ensemble playing skills, gain proficiency on auxiliary instruments, and improve overall clarinet technique and musicianship. Students are also encouraged to contribute their own musical compositions and arrangements for this class.

Grading Procedure

There are four grading components that will be taken into account:

- 1. 40% of the final grade comes from quality of *Ensemble Music Preparation*
- 2. 40% of the final grade comes from quality of Ensemble Music Performance
- 3. 10% of the final grade comes from quality and level of Class Attitude and Participation
- 4. 10% of the final grade comes from *Attendance Record* (based on adherence to the attendance/tardiness policy)

Each course component will be graded independently. The grades awarded by the instructor for each of the six components will be added together and the total earned grade average will dictate the final grade.
