Course Description:

The emphasis of this class will be on theatre skills specific to the performance of musical dramas. Repertoire will primarily include new works by composers creating significant opuses for a changing world.

Course Objectives:

- 1. To study the musical drama as a performer.
- 2. To develop professional rehearsal skills, etiquette, and the ability to work well within a group.
- 3. To improve the students' stage confidence and movement.
- 4. To develop the individual's ability to analyze characters, music, and libretti.

Attire:

Wear comfortable, loose-fitting clothing. T-Shirts and sweat pants are welcome.

Rehearsal Etiquette:

Focus and engagement is paramount to maintaining a professional/creative working environment. Therefore, unless a performer is on an extended break from a scene, smartphones, IPads, laptops, etc. are not to be used.

Recording protocol:

Rehearsals are safe places to experiment, make bold choices, and create expressive theatre with your colleagues. The prospect of images or video recordings of these rehearsals being archived or posted on social media is counterproductive and not allowed.

- Once the piece is ready for public performance, pictures and video will be allowed but ONLY with the permission of everyone in the scene.

* Some scenes will be recorded as a teaching tool but only shown in class.

Required Materials:

- 1. Musical Score
- 2. Pencil at every rehearsal

Final Exam: The Opera Theatre Workshop is performing group. Students will be graded on their final public performance(s) of the assigned musical/opera/outreach in lieu of a written final exam.
