Course Description

Second sequence of courses that develop skills and understanding of written music theory. Skills in this course will include writing and identifying all concepts of four part chorale writing, identifying basic large scale forms, and diving deeper into chromatic harmony.

Exams

Quizzes

Quizzes will be given periodically during the last 15 minutes of class to make sure students are keeping up with assigned readings and actively paying attention in class. They may be announced or unannounced. Formats of quizzes will vary based on content.

Acceptable reasons for absence (excused absences) include illness, serious family emergencies, severe weather conditions, religious holidays, and participation in official university activities.
