

**SYLLABUS

The class will be conducted online for the fall semester. Students join the synchronous ZOOM classes. The ZOOM class will not be recorded.

1. Students will select *one* of the following pieces for the semester. Students are expected to play the piece in class every week to demonstrate their progress.

- Violin: Sonata No. 5 "Spring", mov. 1 by L.V. Beethoven
- Viola: Sonata in e minor, mov. 1 by Rebecca Clarke
- Cello: Sonata No. 3 in A Major by L.V. Beethoven
- Flute: Sonata, mov. 1 by F. Poulenc
- Oboe: Sonata, mov. 1 by F. Poulenc
- Clarinet: Drei Fantasiestucke Op. 73, mov. 1 or mov. 3 by R. Schumann
- Trumpet: Concerto in E flat Major, mov. 1 by J. Hummel
- Horn: Nocturno, Op. 7 by F. Strauss

2. Students will conduct research about the selected piece: background of the composer and the piece, musical form, and etc. Students will make a *brief presentation* in class on **September 8 (Tuesday)**. Based on the research students will submit a *paper* (less than 500 words) by **September 15 (Tuesday) 6 pm**. The details about the paper will be discussed in the first class.

3. Throughout the semester students will choose two professional performances (videos or recordings) of the selected piece and prepare for the *final project paper* on those performances (less than 1000 words).

3. Students will submit a *performance video* in MP4 format through CANVAS by **December 8 (Tuesday) 6 pm**. *The video must be in one continuous take, with no editing.*

6. The *final project paper* due is **December 11 (Friday) 6 pm**.
