<u>Objectives/Goals</u>: To enhance students' knowledge of flute repertoire (including solo literature, small ensembles, etudes, and orchestral excerpts) through score study and research.

<u>Materials</u>: Students will need a flute, a notebook, and a computer appropriate for online meetings. Students will maintain a notebook (hand-written or digital) of material studied during sessions and independent research. There is no required text for this course, scores will be provided by the professor.

Description: Each student will receive one 50-minute individual meeting each week (a total of 13 meetings).

<u>Students may choose to have all meetings online, or to have mostly online meetings with live meetings (with safety regulations) when possible.</u> *

<u>Cancelled meeting policy</u>: If a student feels unprepared or needs to cancel just prior to a meeting, the student forfeits that time. If a student cancels a meeting more than 24 hours in advance due to illness or emergency, the professor may make up the time at her discretion and availability. Whatever the reason, if a student knows he/she will miss a meeting, the professor <u>must</u> be contacted prior to the scheduled time. Be aware that canceling meetings for reasons other than illness or family emergency may affect your grade.

Requirements:

- 1. preparedness for and attendance of each class meeting
- 2. each student will present a final literature project and short research paper
- 3. students will listen to available recordings of works they are studying this will be included in preparation grade
- 4. Behave professionally and respectfully in the School of Music (classes, rehearsals, and performances) as an ambassador of the UF Flute Studio.
- 5. Cell phones must be turned off during all events, including meetings.
- 6. Maintain notes detailing meeting sessions and independent research.
