**Course Description:** Conducting 1 is an introduction to basic conducting concepts focusing on the relationship of gesture to sound, acquisition of basic conducting techniques, and the fundamentals of score reading and score preparation.

# **Learning Objectives:**

### The student conductor will:

- Demonstrate appropriate conducting posture and hand/baton positions
- Demonstrate adequate skill in basic gestural techniques
- Demonstrate appropriate score study/score preparation habits through use of piano and part-singing
- Demonstrate adequate skill in conducting historically appropriate performances through adequate score preparation
- Demonstrate ability to appropriately assess conducting performances
- Exhibit knowledge of basic conducting terminology

# **Learning Activities to meet the Objectives:**

# Conducting Gesture Quizzes (6) [10 points each, total: 60 points]

There will be six (6) conducting gesture assessments in which the student will demonstrate:

- 1. Basic patterns, prep, beats and cut-offs *Due* 9/22/20 by 11:59pm
- 2. Basic articulations and dynamic changes *Due* 10/1/20 by 11:59pm
- 3. Accents and gesture of syncopation Due 10/13/20 by 11:59pm
- 4. Subdivision *Due* 10/22/20 by 11:59pm
- 5. Fermatas Due 11/3/20 by 11:59pm
- 6. Use of left hand *Due* 11/12/20 by 11:59pm

Students will video record themselves performing the assessments and upload the video to the appropriate assignment page in Canvas *before 11:59pm on the due date.* 

## **Classroom Participation**

## [30 points]

Each student will be assigned a total of two (2) in-class conducting sessions. The student is responsible for obtaining an adequate audio/video recording of his/her conducting session.

In addition, each student will be expected to prepare **ALL** pieces covered in their portion of the course (choral or instrumental). Each student will adequately prepare his/her vocal line or instrumental line **AND** be able to conduct the ensemble through the piece.

On Zoom observation days, students are expected to provide at least one constructive critique of each conductor during his/her conducting session in the Zoom chat.

## Conducting Self-Assessments (2)

# [15 points each, total: 30 points]

The student will complete a Conductor's Self-Assessment Form (provided in Canvas) following each of his/her 2 assigned in-class conducting sessions. The student will be assessed on the quality of his/her reflections in each of the assessment subcategories. *Must be uploaded to Canvas no later than 24 HOURS AFTER CONDUCTING SESSION*.

### **Score Terminology Terms Test**

### [50 points]

Students will complete a multiple choice and fill-in-the-blank quiz on conducting terms found in the Score Terminology for the Conductor pdf found in Module 1 of the course Canvas page. This test will be conducted using *Honorlock*. Please read the *exam environment prep info* sheet provided on the test page. *Due* 10/15/20 by 11:59pm.

## Professional conductor evaluation [20 points]

The student will write a 600-800 word evaluation on a professional conductor. The evaluation must be on a conductor of a college choir, orchestra, or wind band – or a similar professional ensemble in a video **performance** (not rehearsal). Evaluations should be based on observations of conducting techniques and musicianship discussed in class. The student must include an active URL for the video used in the paper. *Must be uploaded to Canvas by 12/9 by 11:59pm*.
