Purpose:

To prepare and perform a solo flute recital to the best of our abilities.

Materials:

Students will need a flute, a stand (for home practice and rehearsal), a metronome, and a tuner. Music will be provided by the professor.

Description:

This course helps the student to prepare for a solo recital performance, requiring extra time and effort for both the student and the professor, beyond studio lessons (MVW 3431 or 4441). This includes recital jury preparation, dress rehearsals, and any additional rehearsals that may be required leading up to the performance. The course also includes the professor's time after the recital to prepare video or audio recordings to preserve the performance.

Missed class policy:

If a student must miss a rehearsal, he or she must contact the professor at least 24 hours in advance if at all possible. Excused absences include absences due to illness or family emergency, or required exam for another course (if scheduled *during* our rehearsal). Because we only rehearse once a week, regular attendance is expected and MANDATORY.

Requirements:

Preparedness for and attendance of each lesson and rehearsal (regular practice outside of rehearsal is *required*) Performances: scheduled individually for each student.

Grading:

Students' semester grades will be based entirely on attendance, preparation, and the final performance. The final performance grade is given by the student's recital committee of three School of Music faculty members. For each unexcused absence, your final grade will be lowered (A becomes A-, A- becomes B+, etc...) Regular tardiness will also negatively impact your grade – 3 tardies will equal one unexcused absence. If you are ever in question about your current grade, please consult the professor.

**Rehearsals with your pianist should begin one month prior to the recital date. The recital jury should take place no later than two weeks before the recital, and should be scheduled to accommodate the faculty committee's and the pianist's schedules. The jury does not need to include the chamber ensemble. At the jury, the student should provide a program, with original program notes, for the committee to proofread. The edited program should be submitted to the front office two weeks prior to the recital.

Repertoire requirements for undergraduate recitals:

One piece from the Baroque period One piece from either the Classical or Romantic period One piece from the 20th or 21st centuries (preferably with extended techniques) One unaccompanied work One chamber work A single work may fulfill multiple requirements Total program length: 35-40 minutes of music for Junior recitals, 40-50 for Senior recitals

HOW THINGS WILL WORK THIS SEMESTER:

- Starting January 13, Dr. Pickeral will begin scheduling degree recitals for music majors. Because we are still in pandemic-precautions mode, the method of recording and delivery will remain the same as in the Fall 2020 semester, which means that we will continue to practice all established social distancing requirements.
- We will find a two-period block during which you will record your performance, without an audience, in MUB 101 or 120. Only the performers and studio teacher should be in the room during this process. We will also schedule a two-period rehearsal in the same space during the week before your recital recording.
- The recital recording will be submitted to the School of Music and later posted on a UF media host. Students may not post or livestream their recitals using outside hosts such as YouTube since UF's copyright license only applies to performances that originate from a university website.
- In order to minimize social contact in the SOM Office, please plan to meet with Dr. Pickeral via Zoom or telephone during his office hours on MWF, 9 AM-noon beginning January 13. - Once we have set a date/time for your recital recording, there is a modified recital form you can use to collect your committee signatures. Dr. Pickeral will also provide information on program submission. Programs will be distributed electronically since there will be no live audience. Guidelines for safe social distancing, room refreshing, and other protocols will be given then as well.
