Course Objective:

- Students will thoroughly understand the correct terminology, content, methodology and fundamentals of acting through the use of Laban Efforts/Drives, Faye Simpsion's Lucid Body Technique and Physical Action.
- Students are required to communicate ideas, context and knowledge both written and spoken surrounding the core rules of acting.
- Students will be required to listen and analyze information to successfully problem solve acting hurdles.

UF catalog description:

 The discipline and creative process of acting: formal and improvisational techniques for developing vocal, physical and analytical skills.

Course content:

- Students are required to be fully engaged in class and actively participate.
- Students are required to be memorized on off-book days.
- Students are required to complete short written assignments to show their comprehension of the lesson in class and input them into scene and monologue work.
- Required to see two Plays (John Proctor is the Villain and Three Sisters.) Must write an acting critique paper for **ONE** of these shows.

Required Materials:

- Students need a folder, highlighters and writing materials (Notebooks and Pencil).
- Students need to have comfortable clothing to move around freely.
- Students are required to keep monologues and scenes that are assigned to them.

Attendance Policy: Attendance will be taken before every class. Due to this class being extremely participatory based, attendance from students is required. That being said, you are allowed 2 UNEXCUSED absences. On your third unexcused absence, a 10% deduction will affect your final grade.
