Course Description

The aim of this course is to develop the ensemble skills in the piano ensemble and collaborative piano setting. This course is designed for piano majors and minors who have successfully completed the two semesters of MVK 3702 (Piano Accompanying). This course will meet online this semester with an option of recording some projects in person.

Course Objectives

This course aims to expose the student to the realm of literature for piano ensembles and enhance their musicianship by incorporating technology. Students will learn various skills to improve their sense of rhythm, collaboration, and understanding of musical structures.
