Course Description

Third of a sequence of four courses that develop skills in sight singing and ear training. Prereq: MUT 1242L.

Course Objectives

- To develop and reinforce skills such as dictation, sight singing, rhythmic sight reading, meter, and notational practice.
- An understanding of the common elements and organizational patterns of music and their interaction, the ability to employ this understanding in aural, verbal, and visual analyses, and the ability to take aural dictation. (NASM VIII B. 2.a)

Topics for the semester*:

Reinforcement and review of all diatonic intervals (melodic and harmonic), Chord Quality Identification (including seventh chords), cadence identification, interval singing, chromatic solfege, asymmetric meters, advanced harmonic dictations, melodic and rhythmic error detection, advanced rhythmic sight reading, pitch awareness, advanced melodic and rhythmic dictation.

*not limited to the list above. Topics could be adjusted depending on pacing of course and overall ability of students in class.

Course Components for Evaluation

• Weekly Singing Assignments (10 TOTAL)

Students will submit to CANVAS audio recordings of their assigned weekly singing examples. Singing examples will be posted to CANVAS in a weekly assignment module at the beginning of each week. Students will post their audio files to the assignment tab in the corresponding assignment portal for each Weekly Singing Assignment. Students are required to use the moveable do system (including do-based minor and chromatic solfege) and a metronome for all assigned examples. If a student does not use the above solfege system and/or a metronome, he/she/they will receive half credit on the assignment. Students will not receive credit on the assignment if they utilize a keyboard instrument to play along as they are singing examples. Video files will not be accepted and will result in a zero being assigned!

Weekly Rhythm Assignments (10 TOTAL)

Students will submit to CANVAS audio recordings of their assigned weekly rhythm examples. Rhythm examples will be posted to CANVAS in a weekly assignment module at the beginning of each week. Students will post their audio files to the assignment tab in the corresponding assignment portal for each Weekly Rhythmic Assignment. Students **are required to use a metronome** at the assigned tempo during recording and execute the rhythm by "tah-ing," counting, or other verbal method for all assigned examples. If a student does not use a metronome during the recording, he/she/they will receive *half credit* on the assignment. Video files will not be accepted and will result in a zero being assigned!

Weekly Dictation Assignments [Auralia and Canvas] (10 TOTAL)

Students will submit weekly dictation assignments through Auralia and/or Canvas. On the Monday of each week an assignment is due, the instructor will post assignment instructions to Canvas and verbally go over the assignment in class. To be prepared for these assignments, students are strongly encouraged to review practice material set up in the Auralia program, review any supplementary instructional resources posted to Canvas as well as participate in class.

• Singing and Rhythmic Sight Reading Tests (2 TOTAL)

During testing weeks (*see course outline*), students will take a singing and rhythmic sight reading test. These tests will assess students' ability to sing melodies and verbally execute rhythms at sight. Students are required to use moveable do (do based minor included) solfege on the sight singing portion of the test and can transpose the key to better fit their voice, if necessary. For the rhythmic sight reading portion of the test, students can "tah," count, or use any other verbal method to execute rhythms.
