Course Description

Planning, preparation, and presentation of degree recital.

Instructor's Educational Philosophy

As a teacher, it is my responsibility to offer each student the opportunity to learn and progress in the art of music. It is my goal to help students reach their musical potential. It is my desire to impart in each student my acquired musical knowledge and a lifelong dedication towards musical excellence. It is also my desire to share my artistic achievements and professional expertise. I wish to pass on the musical knowledge and traditions that have been instilled in me during my years of study and throughout my experiences as a performer, educator, and human being. It is my intent to nurture musical and artistic growth through inspirational instruction and a structured, goal-oriented curriculum. I will endeavor to provide a supportive and positive learning environment where I can offer constructive criticism when necessary. I will adhere to the highest artistic standards and will maintain high expectations of all students regardless of their background or level of study. I will be realistic in my expectations. I will strive for open and honest communication with each student in an atmosphere of trust and mutual respect.

Course Outline

The instructor will make individual recital repertoire assignments at the beginning of the semester, in consultation with each student. The student will study each work in depth in preparation for the recital. **Written program notes are required for all solo recitals.** Each student will form a three-member recital committee comprised of the studio teacher (chair), another woodwind area faculty member, and one faculty member from an outside area.

Course Objectives

The successful performance of a solo recital. Students are encouraged to listen critically to themselves during the preparation process to consistently improve their performance and with a goal of performing at the highest level of excellence at the recital.

Instructor's Expectations

Each student is expected to practice daily and learn recital repertoire well in advance of the recital date. Each student is expected to work diligently in preparation for the recital. *It is the student's responsibility to find an accompanist (at their own expense) and to schedule adequate rehearsal time.* Lessons with accompaniment should take place a *minimum of twice* before the recital.

Recital Performances

Solo recitals are required of undergraduate music majors as follows:

- Junior: Performance Majors, Music in Combination Majors, and Music Education Majors (30-45 minutes of music)
- Senior: Performance Majors and Music in Combination Majors/Music Education Majors who are seeking a Certificate in Performance (45-60 minutes of music)

Required Materials

Student will purchase and perform from original printed copies of all recital repertoire. Instruments and related equipment must be kept in excellent condition.

Grading Procedure

The grade will be based preparation, attendance, and on the quality of the recital performance as follows: Preparation -20%

Attendance – 10%

Recital Performance – 70%

The recital performance portion of the grade will be determined through averaging the grades given by the three faculty recital committee members. Grading scale as follows:
