HUM 4912: Fine Arts Undergraduate Research (0-3 Credits)

Course Description: The Fine Arts Undergraduate Research course will provide students with an opportunity for mentored research learning and experience. Students will participate consistently in the Center for Arts in Medicine's Interdisciplinary Research Lab, which meets weekly on Fridays from 2-4:30pm via Zoom. Students will undertake research as assigned during that time as well as outside of the weekly meeting.

# **Student Learning Outcomes**

o Students will identify, analyze and practice research skills as assigned

Course Format and Content: Course activities will be defined by the instructor within the weekly team meeting structure. Activities may include field research, literature review, reading, data collection, data analysis, and writing.

#### **Evaluation and Grades**

This course is graded on an S/U basis. S grades will be assigned to students who consistently attend the Friday research lab meetings and demonstrate significant involvement and achievement in the team research process. More than three unexcused absences will constitute a U grade.

100% of the final grade comes from attendance and active participation in the weekly research lab meetings and additional work, as assigned.

# **Grading Criteria**

Students are expected to attend all weekly research team meetings and to complete work as assigned throughout the term. Students with more than three <u>un</u>excused absences will not receive an S grade unless provisions for completing all work as assigned are made with the instructor.

### In-class recording

Students are allowed to record video or audio of class lectures. However, the purposes for which these recordings may be used are strictly controlled. The only allowable purposes are (1) for personal educational use, (2) in connection with a complaint to the university, or (3) as evidence in, or in preparation for, a criminal or civil proceeding. All other purposes are prohibited. Specifically, students may not publish recorded lectures without the written consent of the instructor.

A "class lecture" is an educational presentation intended to inform or teach enrolled students about a particular subject, including any instructor-led discussions that form part of the presentation, and delivered by any instructor hired or appointed by the University, or by a guest instructor, as part of a University of Florida course. A class lecture does not include lab sessions, student presentations, clinical presentations such as patient history, academic exercises involving solely student participation, assessments (quizzes, tests, exams), field trips, private conversations between students in the class or between a student and the faculty or lecturer during a class session.

Additionally, a recording, or transcript of a recording, is considered published if it is posted on or uploaded to, in whole or in part, any media platform, including but not limited to social media, book, magazine, newspaper, leaflet, or third party note/tutoring services. A student who publishes a recording without written consent may be subject to a civil cause of action instituted by a person injured by the publication and/or discipline under UF Regulation 4.040 Student Honor Code and Student Conduct Code.

# Privacy and Related Issues

Our lab sessions may be audio visually recorded for students in the class to refer back and for enrolled students who are unable to attend live. Students who participate with their camera engaged or utilize a profile image are agreeing to have their video or image recorded. If you are unwilling to consent to have your profile or video image recorded, be sure to keep your camera off and do not use a profile image. Likewise, students who un-mute during class and participate orally are agreeing to have their voices recorded. If you are not willing to consent to have your voice recorded during class, you will need to keep your mute button activated and communicate exclusively using the "chat" feature, which allows students to type questions and comments live.
