GRADING:

The student will be evaluated based on:

-class observations (every two weeks)

-level of preparedness for each of the observed classes.

-the quality of the educational materials used

-the level of engagement of the students enrolled in the class.

-the growth that his or her students demonstrate during class assignments and specific projects.

The student will meet with me once a week (at the minimum) to discuss the progress of the class, ask for feedback or advise and inform me about any teaching related concerns.
