Course Description/Purpose:

This individual study course addresses an identified topic within the field of stage management. The course is used by students to research and obtain knowledge that is not part of an offered course in the stage management curriculum.

Upon completion of this course, students will:

- Identify and propose a topic for research or investigation
- Determine and facilitate realistic project goals
- Develop topic specific methodology
- Incorporate acquired knowledge in a research paper, document, presentation, or tangible product
- Present progress and outcomes to course instructor

Course Requirements & Expectations:

- Proposal form to be submitted to course instructor during the first two weeks of classes for approval. Include:
 - o Proposed topic related to the field of stage management
 - o Goals and learning outcomes
 - o Research/investigation timeline
 - o Self-assessment plan
- Meet with course instructor on a regular basis to discuss progress
- Meet project deadlines
- A final research paper, document, presentation, or tangible project to be submitted to course instructor by the last day of classes
