Vocal training and public performances of varied treble chorus repertoire. 1 credit

Course Objectives

- 1. Students develop and demonstrate proper vocal technique.
- 2. Students deepen their understanding of musical structures and conventions and employ their knowledge as they learn new repertoire.
- 3. Students synthesize a broad range of musical skills by performing a varied repertoire with expression, appropriate stylistic interpretation, technical accuracy, and kinesthetic energy.
- 4. Students explore the cultural and historical contexts of their repertoire to better understand the world, themselves, and their own experiences.

You may miss <u>two</u> rehearsals without consequence. If you are not able to vocally contribute during a particular rehearsal due to illness, but you are still able to attend class (i.e. you are not contagious, feverish, nauseous, or faint), you are strongly encouraged to attend.
