Course Description

This course is designed to familiarize students with the standard works of literature and repertoire of the viola from the instrument's beginnings through the present day. The primary genres of viola literature will be presented (solo, chamber, and orchestral) through each period of music history. Historical, theoretical, and pedagogical aspects of the repertoire will be discussed, as well as information concerning composers, performers, and ensembles.
