#### **COURSE DESCRIPTION**

Music Theory 1 provides students essential theoretical knowledge to apply in related fields of expertise and serves as the steppingstone to advance to higher required courses. Topics included in this course covers fundamental understandings of structural elements of music.

## **COURSE OBJECTIVES**

Upon completion of this course, students will develop skills as follows:

- Improve music notation.
- Solidify understanding of music theory rudiments.
- Successfully voice-lead a cantus firmus using different types of species counterpoint.
- Gain an introductory overview of four-part chorale writing to advance to Music Theory 2.

# **ATTENDANCE**

Due on April 30<sup>th</sup>, the final exam will be accessible in 24 hours before it closes, giving students ample time to complete and submit on canvas. This take-home exam is the last trial that evaluates the students' knowledge on all units introduced through the entire semester.
