COURSE OBJECTIVES

- To learn the fundamentals of improvisation

- To create intelligent and honest scene work through conceptual agreement, character creation, team building, and active listening

REQUIRED TEXT

Readings will come in the form of handouts.

EXPECTATIONS

This class is a space where you respect, support, and encourage your fellow actors. In order to grow as a performer, you will be asked to take risks in the games, exercises, and performance pieces you do for class. "Playing at the top of your intelligence" is a key concept in improvisation. Come to class prepared to move. Warm-ups and scenework can be physically demanding (rolling on the floor is not uncommon). Don't wear clothes that you are afraid to get "mussed" or limit your mobility. There is no eating, drinking (except water), gum chewing, computer, or cell phone use in class.

ATTENDANCE POLICY

This is a class about participation – attendance is a given. You are expected to arrive ON TIME and to attend ALL classes. If you feel you cannot make this commitment, please drop the class. Since working live with others is the primary focus of the class, there is no way to make up missed class time. When you work in teams, missing class hurts your peers and supporting each other is an essential part of this work.

Any absence from class for the following reasons must be supported by official documentation to avoid a grade penalty:

- Illness
- Special curricular requirements (e.g., judging trips, field trips, professional conferences)
- Military obligation
- Severe weather conditions
- Participation in official university activities such as music performances, athletic competition (not Rec Sports) or debate
- Court-imposed legal obligations (e.g., jury duty or subpoena)

Serious family emergencies and religious observances do not require documentation. However, you need to let me know by the second week of classes which religious observances will conflict with your attendance.

Students are allowed ONE unexcused absence that does not require documentation and does not conform to the UF "acceptable reasons for absence." Afterwards, each unexcused absence will result in a penalty of a full letter grade (10%) deducted from your final grade. Weddings, travel, job interviews, non-UF auditions, and other life events do not count as excused absences. If you have a logistical problem that will prevent you from arriving on time, let me know immediately.

Any student that has THREE absences (either excused or unexcused) will be required to meet with me to discuss your continued participation in the course. For BFA Majors, failure to attend this meeting will result in Artistic Probation.
