Course Components for Evaluation

Weekly Participation and Preparation

It is the expectation that students attend all rehearsals except for those excused in advance (see absence policy below). It is the expectation that students will arrive on time with all assigned parts practiced and prepared. Any unexcused absence from rehearsals will result in a drop of 5% from the "Weekly Participation and Preparation" portion of the course.

There will be one performance that is the culmination of the course rehearsals/meetings. It is the expectation that all students will show up in the predetermined performance attire and participate in the concert as part of the clarinet choir/ensembles.

Clarinet Choir Course Policies

- Cell phones, laptop computers, and other electronic devices are **not to be used during rehearsal/performance** as they disrupt students' attention and are a distraction to all (if the student wishes to use a tablet for music reading purposes they may ask permission from the instructor, however any incident where the device is found to be used for any other purpose other than music reading will result in a loss of this privilege). Any non-approved use of these devices **will result** in a dismissal from the class/performance and an assigned unexcused absence for the day. If a student needs to use an electronic device due to a documented disability, he/she/they need to notify the instructor immediately so an accommodation can be made.
- Students are expected to arrive on time and prepared for clarinet choir rehearsal.

Attendance Policy:

- The instructor requires at least 24 hours' notice through email if the student needs to miss clarinet choir rehearsal. Excused absences will be determined at the discretion of the instructor and in accordance with the university attendance policy.
- Each student will be extended one absence without penalty with prior email notification to the instructor (not to be used for the dress rehearsal).
- Any unexcused absences will result in a drop of 5% from the "Weekly Participation and Preparation" portion of the course.
- Attendance at the dress rehearsal and performance are mandatory. Only absences that are officially documented will be considered for excuse by the instructor.

• Communication Policies:

- The instructor will utilize email as the main form of communication outside of class. It is expected that students check their email multiple times a week to not miss important announcements, postings, etc. Students are expected to respond to their instructor's inquiries, either verbally or through email, in a timely manner. Any emails sent to the instructor from a non-UF account will not receive a response.
- Clarinet Choir/ensemble members are required to treat each other with respect and civility. If there are any issues regarding inappropriate behavior towards others and/or towards the instructor, the instructor will first discuss the matter in an office hour appointment with the student; if multiple inappropriate behaviors continue to occur, the instructor will report these incidents to the Student Conduct & Conflict Resolution Office.
- The instructor reserves the right to dismiss any student who is disruptive, disrespectful, or uncivil.

Reeds Clause

The student must have a playable reed for clarinet choir. If a student has issues getting playable reeds, it is imperative they bring it up to the instructor to work out a solution. Additionally, it is expected that the student rotate their good reeds!

Materials Clause

It is the student's responsibility to come prepared to the rehearsals/performance. If the student foresees any barriers or encounters any issues that would hinder them from meeting this requirement, they are strongly encouraged to contact the instructor for help.

Concert Dress Code Clause

For the Clarinet Choir Fall Concert, it is expected that students wear the predetermined appropriate concert attire.
