# **OBJECTIVES:**

The purpose of this course is to develop the artistic and practical aspects of designing for theater in the student's area of focus, with emphasis on conceptual thinking and the collaborative design process. This class prepares a student to conceptualize, design, and promote their work creating skills that sync with the needs of their future career. The course is designed to introduce students to the design processes and expectations for realized work within the School of Theatre and Dance. Guiding the students through group work sessions provides faculty mentors the opportunity to identify strengths as well as areas for improvement in order to broaden and refine individual abilities and an understanding of the other areas of design.

#### **PROGRAM OUTCOMES:**

This course addresses the following program outcomes:

- Giving students background and developing skills necessary to address design work in the departmental curriculum.
- Providing students with training and information required to complete work in the practical production program.
- Teaching students how to develop and apply research, design fundamentals, techniques for collaboration, and presentation skills during the design process as an essential component of assignments and production work

# **LEARNING OUTCOMES:**

After completing this course, students should be able to:

- Conceive and research design projects.
- Organize and translate conceptual work into practical applications.
- Communicate ideas visually and verbally.
- Manage their time efficiently.
- Have critical conversations about the history and future of the field.
- Develop professional materials for post- graduation success.

#### **EXPECTATIONS:**

- Graduate school is a self- motivated journey. You will get out of this program as much as you are willing to put in.
- The faculty views the program wholistically: we have 3 years together to learn, explore, and develop as designers. It will take a full 3 years. Choose to trust the journey.

# **PROJECT DESCRIPTIONS:**

**DESIGN PROJECTS** will follow the process and expectations laid out in the All-Designers Documents which can be found on canvas. These theoretical designs teach the expected process you will follow in realizing productions at The School of Theatre and Dance. Each meeting laid out in the All-Designers document corresponds with a Design Meeting in the course calendar. At Design Meetings please be prepared to present as laid out in the guidelines. You are expected to be prepared for each session with progress towards your next design meeting and the appropriate materials to work during class. Each step of your process will be submitted as one .pdf to Canvas for grading.

# **PROFESSIONAL MATERIALS:**

1<sup>st</sup> Year Students: Faculty will review your incoming professional materials and offer feedback for improvement. <u>Faculty will review these materials AS IS</u>. Please do not work on them until you have received feedback. It is expected that you will improve upon your materials each semester you are enrolled in the program. The next review of your materials will take place in January at our annual Fusion exhibition.

3<sup>rd</sup> Year Students: Faculty will review all of your professional materials and offer feedback. Incorporated into your in class work is preparation for a physical portfolio exhibit in order to prepare you for participation in Design Showcase South/East/West. Your goal should be to have a dry run of your exhibit fully prepared for Fusion in January so you can receive helpful feedback at that time.

Please note: SoTD is a sponsor of Design Showcase South hosted at the Alliance Theatre in Atlanta in late Spring (Date to be announced in October). While attendance is not required, the School will cover the participation fee for Design Showcase South ONLY. You can apply for funding for other events but it is not guaranteed.

**ADDITONAL EXERCISES:** Additional exercises will be added at the discretion of the faculty based on the needs of the students in the course. Assignments will be graded and are expected to be engaged in fully and delivered on time.

#### **GRADING:**

The projects will be evaluated and critiqued in stages, with the project grade based on these stages of work, including artistic/conceptual work application of feedback, presentation, and adherence to deadlines. In theatre, time is money, and opening night is unlikely to be delayed until a designer manages to complete work. The grading scale will be as follows:
