CLASS DECORUM

This class is of an exploratory and experimental nature. Exercises require full participation and often a sense of humor and a sense of "play." In order to foster a trusting and creative environment, respect of the instructor and of fellow students is essential. Please feel free to see me with any reservations you may have about the explorations in this class.

Also, respect your classmates as you would have them respect you. Give your full attention to your classmates as they work. There will be zero tolerance for cell phone use (including texting), sleeping, eating drinking, doing work for other classes, reading, or disruptive talking in class. If you engage in any of these behaviors, your overall final grade will be reduced by 20 points for each offense.

Notes must be taken by hand. No laptops, tablets, of other electronic devices can be open once class has begun.

HOW TO TAKE THIS COURSE:

This course is pyrimidal, with each subsequent exploration building on the one prior. Students are expected to learn, retain and employ lessons learned from previous classes and incorporate those into future explorations. As such, all final scenes should be memorized to reflect the escalating level of expectation.

First showing of monologue following discussion of Stanislavski There should be some evidence of script analysis, including the listing of objectives, tactics, obstacles and a clear delegation of beats (or bits). These analytical elements should then be incorporated into the student's performance of the piece.

First showing of monologue following discussion of focal points and imagination

The student should have the piece mostly memorized at this point. Students should incorporate elements from the Stanislavski explorations and the focal points exploration into this unit.

First showing of monologue following discussion of psychological gesture

The piece should be totally memorized at this point. The Psychological Gesture exercises are intensely physical and require the use of the full body. As such, scripts will hinder the student's ability to fully participate in the explorations.

ATTENDANCE

You will be allowed two (2) unexcused absences, but NOT on days in which you either work the piece or perform in front of the class. You will also be allowed two (2) late arrivals but you must tell me you were late after class, otherwise I will count you absent.

LATE ASSIGNMENTS

No late assignments will be accepted unless there is an accompanying emergency that prohibits you from performing. Late busses and/or weather delays will not count as excused absences.

You will also be responsible for finding and reading plays from which your scenes and monologues will come. All class material must come from published plays.

REQUIRED VIEWING

You will receive coupons to purchase discounted tickets for \$2.00 to three productions this term. Once in hand, they cannot be replaced so make sure to keep them in a safe place. On the Monday following the final performance there will be an in class quiz testing knowledge of the specific production, not simply the plot of the play, so make sure you attend and give them your full attention.
