Each year *Splendor* brings back a renowned College of the Arts alumni to campus to serve as the featured performer during the Gala Concert. This year, we will welcome back **Felipe**



Bombonato. Bombonato is a graduate of P.K. Yonge Developmental Research School and earned a BFA in Theatre Performance with an emphasis in Musical Theatre from UF's School of Theatre + Dance in 2011. He has toured nationally with *Cats* (vocal swing) and *Man of la Mancha* (muleteer and Padre understudy), has played Judas in *Jesus Christ Superstar*, sailor and Billis understudy in *South Pacific*, and Dr. Scott/Eddie in *The Rocky Horror Show*.

"It is amazing to be coming back to Constans Theatre," said Bombonato. "I have shared so many great memories with so many wonderful people in this theatre. I played Eddie for the first time on that stage. I did my senior thesis role of Stine from *City of Angels* on that stage, and I had a blast being Coach Van Buren in *Damn Yankees*. I love UF and the Gator Nation, and it will always be a part of who I am."

Other entertainment highlights include performances by UF Musical Theatre program students, piano students, UF Opera Theatre program students and students from UF's Dance program performing works choreographed by Pat Graney and Trent D. Williams Jr. The after party will feature the UF Jazz Band under the direction of Scott Wilson with special guests Jim Snyder on clarinet, Dr. Russell Robinson on vocals and Longineu Parsons performing a Louis Armstrong medley.

"Our *Dancing Under the Stars* Gala Concert is sure to get your toes tapping," said Tony Offerle, associate professor in the UF School of Music and artistic director of the gala concert. "Songand-dance man and recent UF alumnus Felipe Bombonato will be our emcee and also a featured performer. The gala itself will be a cavalcade of our most talented students performing dance and dance-themed pieces culminating in a big number from *A Chorus Line*!"

Two ticket packages are available for purchase. The **after party package** is **\$40 per guest** and invites guests to arrive at 8:00 p.m. for the gala concert and then enjoy the silent auction, a cash bar, dessert and after party featuring the UF Jazz Band and dancing.

The **dinner package** is **\$150 per guest or \$250 per pair** and features all the benefits of the after party package and more. Guests will arrive at 5:30 p.m. for cocktails and first access to the silent auction. Dinner catered by Blue Water Bay begins at 6:30 p.m. Valet parking, two drink tickets and all-night access to the Director's Lounge with additional bar service, seating and entertainment is included.
