Additionally, Mitchell also serves as the artistic director of the Washington Festival Chorale, a 60-voice community choir. Laura Ellis is Associate Director and Professor in the School of Music at the University of Florida. She teaches courses in Sacred Music and applied lessons in organ, harpsichord, and carillon. She studied carillon with Albert Gerken during graduate studies at the Unviersity of Kansas and received additional coaching from Karel Keldermans. Ellis is a carillonneur member of The Guild of Carillonneurs in North America (GCNA) and recently served two terms as president of the organization. She remains on the board of the GCNA and is director of the Music and Publications Committee.

Wade FitzGerald is pursuing his Master of Music in Organ Performance with

Dr. Christopher Young at Indiana University's Jacobs School of Music, where he also serves as the University Carillonist and Associate Instructor of Carillon. A native of Tampa, Florida, FitzGerald started piano lessons at age five. He enrolled at the University of Florida in 2015 and began studying the carillon with Dr. Laura Ellis the following year. During college, he worked as a substitute pianist at several churches and as an accompanist for the Gainesville Youth Chorus. FitzGerald was inducted into the Guild of Carillonneurs in North America in 2019 and graduated from UF shortly thereafter with bachelor's degrees in music and biology. In 2020, FitzGerald served for five months as Blanchard Carillon Fellow at Bok Tower in Lake Wales,



Florida, where he studied with award-winning carillonneur and composer Geert D'hollander. In 2021, FitzGerald moved to Pennsylvania, where he began playing the carillon and studying organ with Jeffrey Brillhart at Bryn Mawr Presbyterian Church. Outside of his studies, FitzGerald enjoys hiking, nature photography, reading (particularly cosmic horror), catching snakes, and learning languages.
