Patrick Smith is Associate Professor of Horn and Music History at Virginia Commonwealth University in Richmond, VA. An internationally acclaimed horn player, music educator, lecturer, and clinician, Dr. Smith actively challenges and stimulates students in performance and academic settings. He is an alumnus of the Aspen and Brevard Music Festivals, has served on the faculty of the Eastern Music Festival, and has given recitals and master classes at dozens of schools and universities in the United States and Europe. Dr. Smith has appeared as a soloist with the Emerson String Quartet and made his Carnegie Hall debut in 2008. An expert on jazz French horn history and repertoire, he is the author of "Chronicle of a Phantom: The Julius Watkins Story," which details the life and achievements of the first great American jazz French horn player. Dr. Smith has released two solo albums: "Reflections: Horn Music of Paul Basler," and "Solstice: Horn Music of James Naigus." His third album, "Blame it on My Youth" will be released in summer 2025. Dr. Smith earned his Doctor of Philosophy and Bachelor of Music Education Degrees from the University of Florida, and his Master of Music degree from the Hartt School of Music. His primary teachers include Paul Basler, David Jolley, and Bruce Atwell.

Program and Composer Note

Heavy Metal is a work for brass quintet. Each movement is based on a pitch collection derived from the digits representing the atomic weight of each element used in the creation of most brass instruments. Brass is an alloy comprising of copper and brass. And, many professional models are given a silver finish (many other plating materials are possible including gold and platinum).

James Paul Sain (b. 1959) is Professor of Music at the University of Florida where he teaches electroacoustic and acoustic music composition, theory, and technology. He founded and directed the internationally acclaimed Florida Electroacoustic Music Festival for 17 years. His compositional oeuvre spans all major acoustic ensembles, instrumental and vocal soloists, and embraces electroacoustic music. His works have been featured at major national and international societal events. He has presented his music in concert and given lectures in Asia, Europe, South America and North America. Dr. Sain is President Emeritus of the Society of Composers Inc. He previously served for several terms on the American Composers Alliance Board of Governors. His music is available in print from Brazinmusikanta and American Composers Editions and on CD on the Capstone, Electronic Music Foundation, Innova, University of Lanús, Mark Masters, Centaur, New Ariel, Albany and NACUSA labels.
